

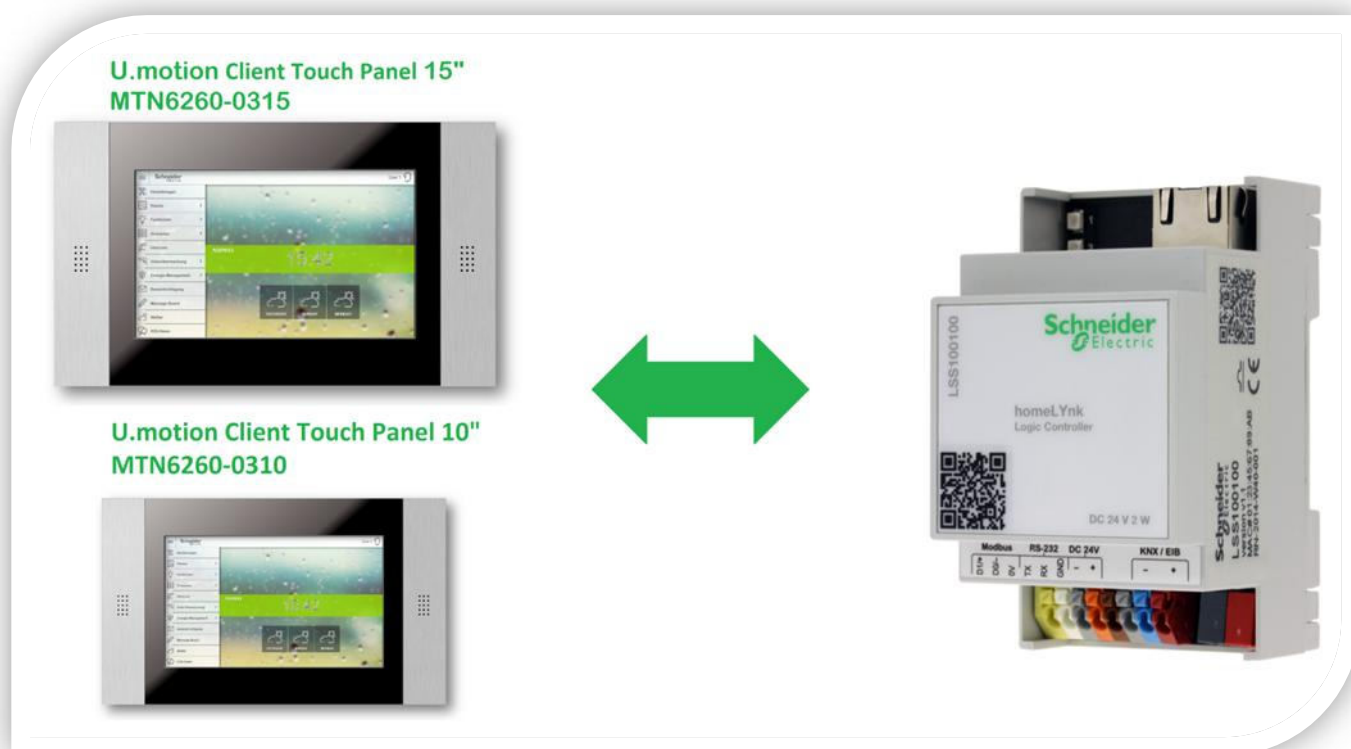

1 Introduction

This application note describes the interoperability of U.motion Client Touch 10" and 15" with homeLYnk.

U.motion Client Touch is a client touch panel for the supervision and visualization of home & building automation systems, which have been realized on the basis of the worldwide KNX standard and homeLYnk.

U.motion Client Touch connects itself via network with a homeLYnk and represents its graphical contents. The configuration and control of the U.motion Client Touch can be done locally on the device or remotely through its web interface, which can be displayed within a common browser (from each supported device / operating system). This chapter describes the configuration of U.motion Client Touch, in order to make it work correctly with a homeLYnk.

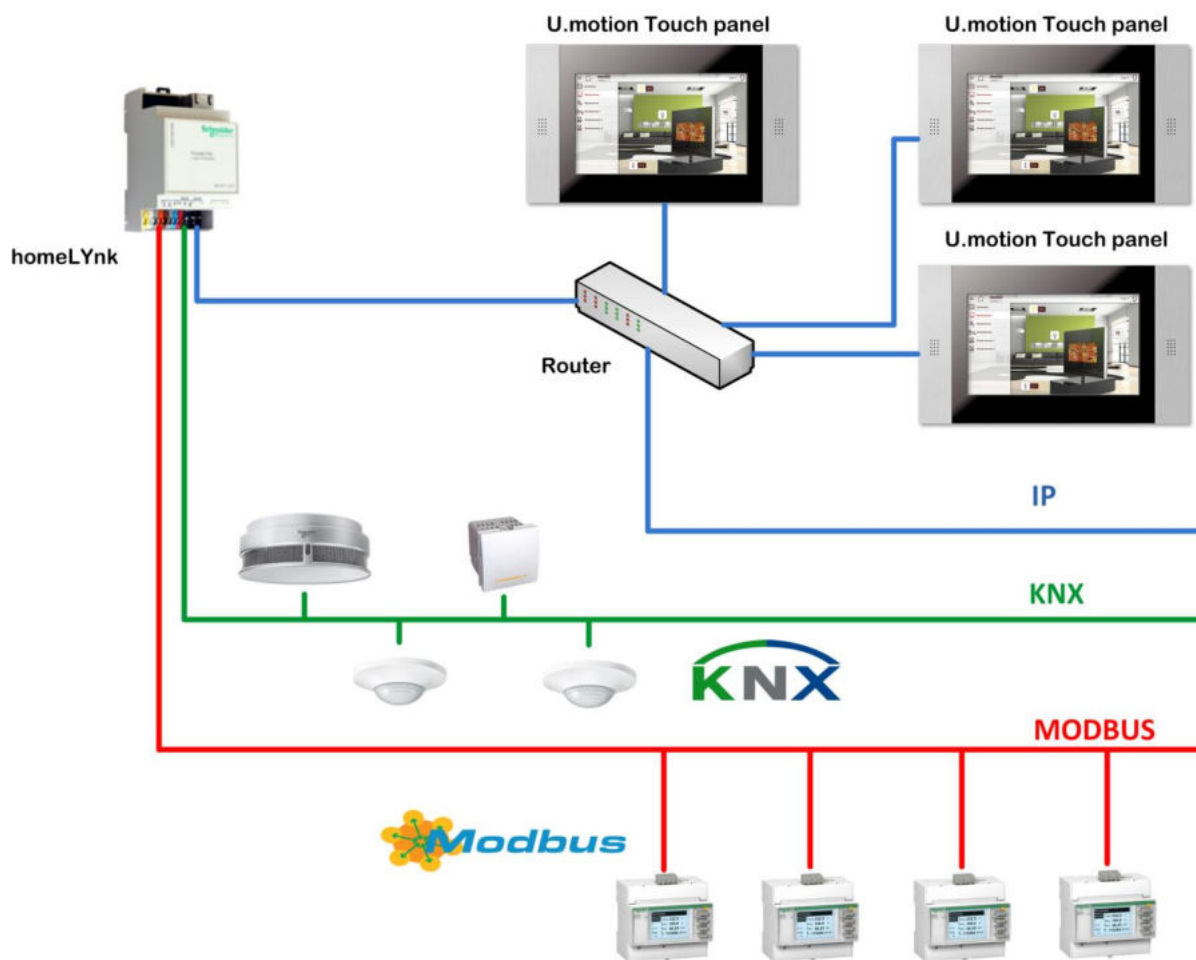

2 SW upgrade

We recommend firmware upgrade in all devices to avoid any operational issues.

2.1 Upgrade of homeLYnk

Note: Please consider possible backward compatibility issues.



2.2 Upgrade of U.motion Touch Panel 10” and 15”

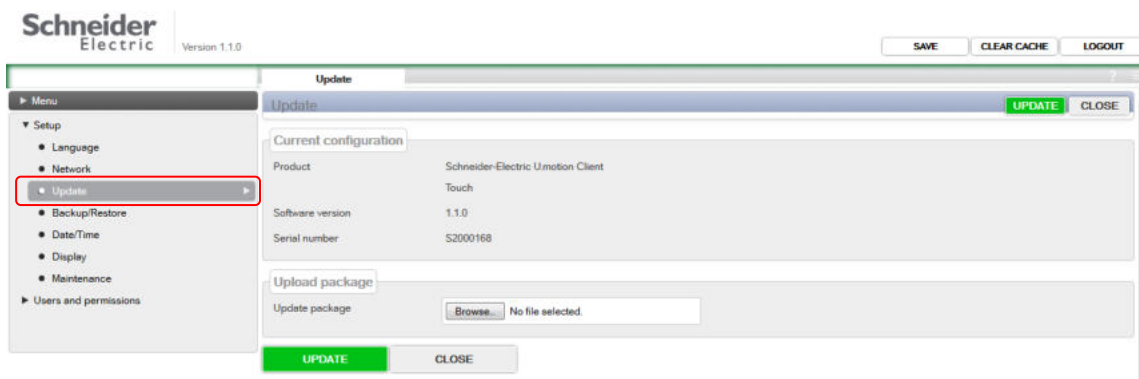
The update process runs completely automatically; please wait for feedback from the page without performing other tasks or exiting the browser (risk of data loss / malfunction). Depending on the configuration and software version, the update may take several minutes.

Firmware consists of two steps:

- 1) Open Update menu
- 2) Upgrade firmware

Step 1: Open Update menu

- a) Open your web browser
- b) Connect to device, fill device's IP address (Default IP: 192.168.0.130)
- c) Login to Configuration menu (Default login: admin, Default password: admin)
- d) Click to **Setup**
- e) Click to **Update**



Step 2: Upgrade firmware

- a) Click to **Browse** button
- b) Choose relevant U.motion FW file
- c) Click to **UPDATE** button
- d) Wait until Update – Summary will be shown
- e) Click to **REBOOT NOW**
- f) Wait until Touch Panel get rebooted – It can take up to 5 minutes
- g) Refresh U.motion webpage (**Press F5**)



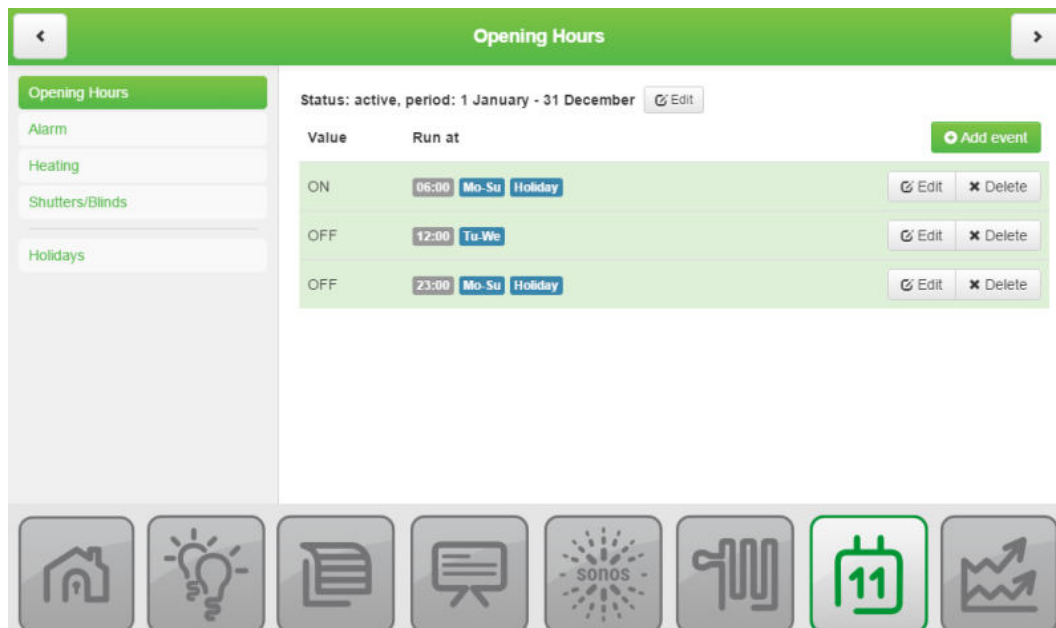
Device is now prepared with upgraded-actual software.

3 Tips and tricks

3.1 Tips and tricks for homeLYnk visualization

3.1.1 Schedulers and trends

Because schedulers and trends are available from **Start page** by default we recommend to create them in frames. This workaround will eliminate unpractical leaving from PC/Tablet visualization page. It is not very comfortable to leave the visualization via keyboard or via holding your finger on screen and then pressing **back** from pop up dialogue window.



3.1.2 How to modify CSS to hide mouse cursor

If you don't want to display mouse cursor on your U.motion Touch Panels, then modify CSS in homeLYnk. Choose the CSS code from below depending on size of your Client Touch Panel.

Warning: Modification also affects PCs and other devices, which has the same screen resolution as defined in CSS code below.

U.motion Client Touch 10"

U.motion Client Touch 15"

@media screen and (device-width: 1366px) and (device-height: 768px) {

    cursor: none !important;
  }
}
```

You can also set a range where the CSS rules are valid

This may be helpful, if you want to hide mouse cursor in more devices with various screen resolution.

3.2 Tips and tricks for U.motion setup

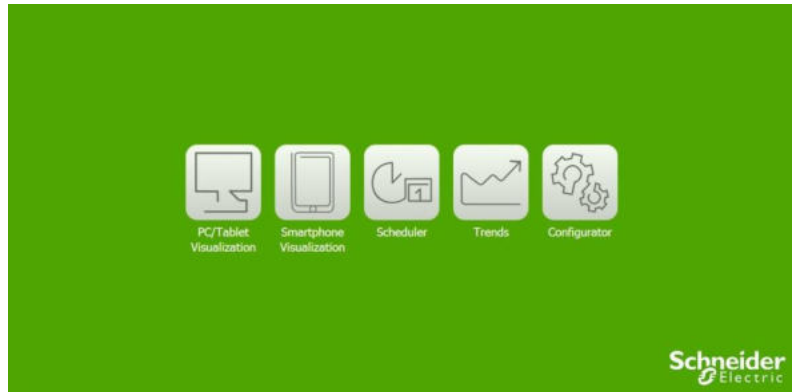
3.2.1 U.motion Main page

Umotion can start on homeLYnk's *Start page*, *Trends*, *Scheduler*, *Visualization* or on some specific plan.

1. Initial page: *Start page*

- **How to:** `http://{homeLYnk IP}/`
- **Example:** `http://10.154.20.81/`

If Touch Panel starts on *Start page*, then icons as *PC/Tablet Visu*, *Trend* and *Scheduler* can be selected. If you have active password access you need hardware keyboard to access *Visu*, *Trends* etc. If you want to go back from



Visu, *Trends* etc. to *Start page*, you have to hold finger on one place until context menu appears and then press **Back**. This can be solved by integration of Schedulers and Trends into Visualization, for more information see chapter 3.1.1.

2. Initial page: Visualization, Trends etc.

- **How to:** `http://{user:password@homeLYnk IP}/cgi-bin/scada-vis/index.cgi`
- **Example:** `http://admin:admin@10.154.20.81/cgi-bin/scada-vis/index.cgi`

In this case the Touch Panel starts directly on the first page of Visualization.

In Umotion setting use actual login/password registered in homeLYnk.

If you are not using password access in homeLYnk, then login information can be removed from link – also @ symbol.

URL for PC/Tablet Visualization: `http://{user:password@homeLYnk IP}/cgi-bin/scada-vis/index.cgi`

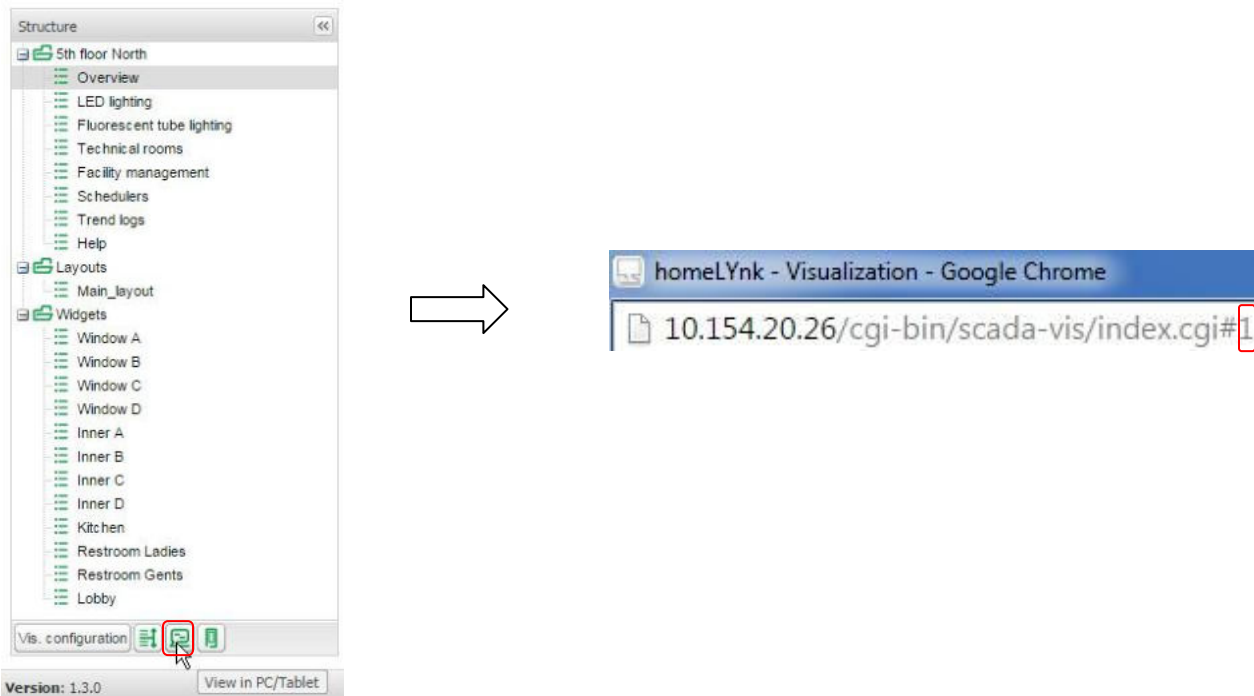
URL for Trends: `http://{user:password@homeLYnk IP}/cgi-bin/scada-vis/trends.cgi`

URL for Schedulers: `http://{user:password@homeLYnk IP}/cgi-bin/scada-vis/schedulers.cgi`

3. Initial page: Specific plan

- **How to:** `http://{user:password@homeLYnk IP /cgi-bin/scada-vis/index.cgi#n}`
- **Example:** `http://admin:admin@10.154.20.26/cgi-bin/scada-vis/index.cgi#1`

Specific plan number can be seen when you open homeLYnk configuration – Visualization tab – Choose plan which you want to display like main page in U.motion and click **View in PC/Tablet**. At the end of URL you will find desired number of plan – see picture below (In pop up window with Visualization).



3.2.2 More Touch Panels connected to one homeLYnk

On one homeLYnk can be simultaneously connected to more than one Touch Panel. Take into consideration CPU load – if you are using homeLYnk like gateway or running a lot of scripts on it, then less users can be connected at one time.

For U.motion Touch Panels we recommend less than three Touch Panels connected at one time. Good optimization of the system is required! For topology see picture “**Topology**” in 1st chapter.

Use case of several Touch Panels in one building - Reception, facility office and employee’s office.

4 Setup of devices

For setup of both devices we recommend to use Google Chrome web browser. Can be downloaded here:

Warning: Be aware that to one Touch Panel can be logged only one user!

4.1 Setup of homeLYnk

homeLYnk doesn't need any special configuration for interoperability with U.motion touch panels. Prepare standard PC/Tablet visualization.

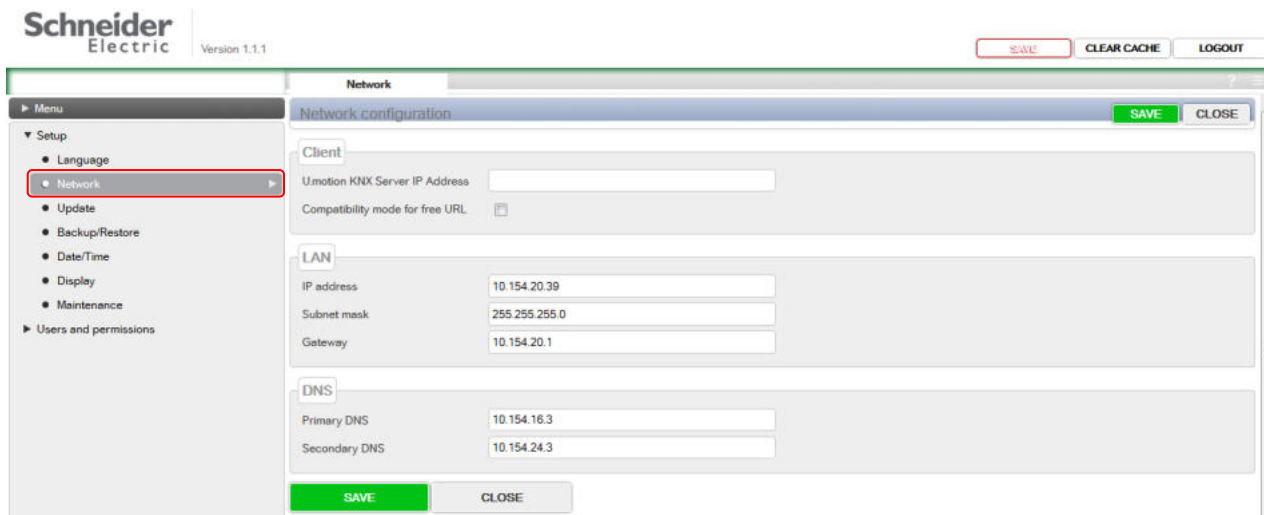
4.2 Setup of U.motion Touch Panel 10" and 15"

Configuration of U.motion consists of three steps:

- 1) Open Network menu
- 2) Configure network configuration
- 3) Reboot device

Step 1: Open Network menu

- a) Open your web browser
- b) Connect to device – fill IP address
- c) Login to configuration menu
- d) Click to **Setup**
- e) Click to **Network**



Step 2: Configure network configuration

- a) Write **U.motion KNX Server IP Address** in relevant format
 - Relevant format can be seen in chapter 3.2.1 in this Application note
 - Example : `http://admin:admin@10.154.20.81/cgi-bin/scada-vis/index.cgi`
- b) Click **SAVE** button under DNS setting table
- c) After automatic reload of page go back to **Network** menu item
- d) Tick **Compatibility mode for free URL** checkbox
- e) Wait approx 1 minute until Umotion touch panel get rebooted
- f) Click **SAVE** button on the top next to CLEAR CACHE

Step 3: Reboot device

- a) Click to **Maintenance**
- b) Click to **REBOOT** next to Reboot system
- c) Wait until Umotion reboot

U.motion is now prepared for usage with homeLYnk visualization.

4.3 Troubleshooting

1. **Sheet of paper icon** – This icon can be seen only in visualization created in homeLYnk v1.3.0 or older. This issue may appear when you hold finger on one place. Please upgrade your homeLYnk to v1.3.1 or higher, or modify Custom CSS by this code:

2. **Inaccurate touch on icons** – If you meet with issue that you are not able to “touch” comfortably for first try on icons please execute calibration of screen. **Configuration menu – Setup – Display – Calibration.**
